1. Heard learned counsel for the Petitioners and learned counsel for the State.

2. This is an application under Section 438 Cr.P.C. filed by the Petitioners for anticipatory bail for the offences punishable under Sections 147/148/341/365/385/387/506/149, I.P.C.

3. Keeping in view the submission of the parties and having gone through the nature of allegations as emerged from the materials on record, and further the circumstances appearing, the seriousness and gravity of the offences, it is directed that in the event the Petitioners surrender in connection with G.R. Case No.907 of 2022 arising out of Angul Industrial PS(NISA) P.S. Case No.196 of 2022 pending in the Court of learned J.M.F.C., Chhendipada within a period of three weeks' from today and moves for bail, they shall be allowed to go on bail on such terms and conditions as would be deemed just

and proper by the said court, but subject to verification of criminal antecedents of the Petitioners. If it is found that there is more than one criminal antecedent of similar nature against the Petitioners, then this bail order shall not be given effect to.

However, while imposing conditions for bail, learned court in seisin over the matter shall also impose the further conditions that

- (i) the Petitioners shall appear in person before the learned court below on each date of posting of the case and shall appear before the I.O. / I.I.C. of the concerned P.S. once in a week on such date and time fixed by the I.O. / I.I.C. for a period of six months.
- (ii) They shall not leave the jurisdiction of the court in seisin over the matter without specific prior permission of the said court.
- (iii) Violation of any of the conditions shall entail cancellation of bail of the Petitioners.

4. The ABLAPL is disposed of accordingly.

5. Urgent certified copy of this order be granted as per rules.
