1. This matter is taken up through video conferencing.
2. This is an application under Sec.439 Cr.P.C. for bail and the offence alleged is under Sec.20(b)(ii)(C) of the NDPS Act for alleged possession of contraband ganja weighing 23.100 grams.
3. Heard Ms. R. Rajgarhia, learned counsel for the Petitioner as well as Mr. M.K. Mohanty, learned A.S.C. for the State-Opposite Party.
4. Having heard both the parties, I am not inclined to release the Petitioner on bail keeping in view the embargo contained under Sec.37(1)(b) of the NDPS Act. Accordingly, the prayer for bail is rejected.
5. The BLAPL is dismissed.
