The petitioner has filed this writ petition seeking direction to the opposite parties to regularize the service of the petitioner as Ayurvedic Medical Officer w.e.f. 26.02.2009 when the similar circumstanced persons have been regularized, along with all consequential service and financial benefits within a stipulated time.

In course of hearing, learned counsel for the petitioner states that the petitioner has already made representation before opposite party no.1 vide Annexure-10, and the same may be directed to be disposed of within a stipulated time taking into consideration Annexure-5 within a stipulated time, to which learned State Counsel has raised no objection.
