2. Heard learned counsel for the parties
3. The petitioner has filed this writ petition seeking direction to the opposite parties, more particularly opposite party no.3 to release arrear salary and consequential benefits from 08/1996 to 04/1997 and differential pay from 1996, as she is entitled to, within a stipulated time.

In course of hearing, learned counsel for the petitioner states that highlighting the grievance, the petitioner has made representation to the opposite party no.3 vide Annexure-4 and direction may be given to consider and dispose of the same, within a stipulated time, to which learned Standing Counsel for School & Mass Education Department has no objection.

As agreed to by learned counsel for the parties, this Court without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case, disposes of the writ petition directing the opposite party no.3 to take a decision on the representation filed by the petitioner vide Annexure-4, and pass appropriate order in accordance with law, within a period of three months from the date of production of certified copy of this order by the petitioner.
