This matter is taken up through hybrid mode.

2. Heard learned counsel for the petitioner.

3. The petitioner has filed this writ petition seeking direction to the opposite parties to engage him as Ganasikshyak in view of the Government Resolution dated 16.02.2008 under Annexure-6 and the order dated 03.07.2008 under Annexure-8, as he is otherwise entitled for the same in view of the fact that similarly situated persons have already been engaged as Ganasikshyak in compliance of the order passed by this Court in the case of ***Sulochana Nayak v. State of Orissa*** (W.P.(C) No.3317 of 2009 disposed of on 07.04.2009).

4. In course of hearing, learned counsel for the petitioner states that highlighting the grievance, the petitioner has made representation to the opposite party no.1 vide Annexure-12 and direction be given to consider and dispose of the same within a stipulated time, to which learned Standing Counsel for School & Mass Education Deptt. has no objection.

5. As agreed to by learned counsel for the parties, this Court disposes of the writ petition directing the opposite party no.1 to take a decision on the representation filed by the petitioner vide Annexure-12 and pass appropriate order in accordance with law, within a period of three months from the date of production of certified copy of this order by the petitioner.
