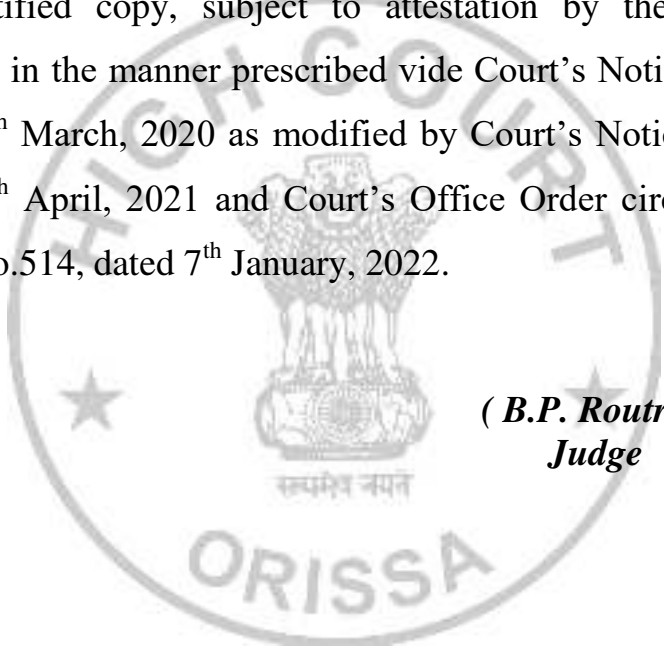

1. This matter is taken up through video conferencing.
2. This is an application under Sec.439 Cr.P.C. for bail and the offences alleged are under Secs.306/34, I.P.C.
3. Heard Mr. P.S. Das, learned counsel for the Petitioner as well as Mr. K. Nayak, learned A.S.C. for the State-Opposite Party.
4. It is submitted that the Petitioner is a woman and inside custody since 2.11.2021 and no material is there to suggest any abatement on the part of the Petitioner since the victim committed suicide for failing to marry the son of the Petitioner.
5. Upon hearing learned A.S.C. for the State-Opposite Party and considering the circumstances of the case, it is directed to release the Petitioner on bail in connection with Kodala P.S. Case

No.290/2019 corresponding to G.R. Case No.344/2019 on such terms and conditions to be fixed by the learned J.M.F.C., Kodala as he deems just and proper.

6. The BLAPL is accordingly disposed of.
