This matter is taken up through video conferencing mode.

2. Heard.

3. The petitioner has filed this writ petition seeking direction to opposite parties to extend 1/3<sup>rd</sup> of service benefits and residual benefits of his deceased father.

4. In course of hearing, learned counsel for the petitioner states that highlighting the grievances, the petitioner has made a representation to opposite party No.3 vide Annexures-7 and 9 and the same may be directed to be considered within a stipulated time.

Considering the limited grievance of the petitioner, this Court, without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case, disposes of the writ petition directing opposite party No.3 to consider the representation filed by the petitioner vide Annexures-7 and 9, and pass appropriate order in accordance with law within a period of three months from the date of production of the authenticated/certified copy this order.
