This matter is taken up through hybrid mode.

2. Heard learned counsel for the parties.
3. The petitioner has filed this writ petition seeking direction to opposite parties 3 to 6 to disburse the arrear outstanding honorarium/remuneration of 38 months to the tune of Rs.2,28,000/- in respect of the petitioner as per the allocation of funds under Annexure-7 and 14 within a stipulated time.
4. In course of hearing, learned counsel for the petitioner states that highlighting the grievances, the petitioner has made representation to the opposite party no.4 vide Annexure-17 series and the same may be directed to be disposed of within a stipulated time, taking into consideration Annexures-7, 14, 15 and 18, to which learned Counsel for the State has raised no objection.
5. As agreed to by learned counsel for the parties, however, without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case, this writ petition stands disposed of directing the opposite party no.4 to consider the representation filed by the petitioner vide Annexure-17 series, taking into consideration Annexures-7, 14, 15 and 18 and pass appropriate order in accordance with law within a period of three months from the date of production of certified copy of this order.
