Petition filed under Article 226 of the Constitution of India praying to issue a writ of Certiorarified Mandamus to call for the records relating to the impugned G.O.(D).No.223 Public (Establishment II) Department dated 30.06.2020 and the impugned G.O.(D).No.224 Public (Establishment II) Department dated 30.06.2020 and the subsequent impugned G.O.(D)No.225 Public (Establishment-II) Department dated 30.06.2020 issued by the 1st respondent and to quash the same and consequently directing the first respondent to allow the petitioner to retire from service as on date of retirement with all consequential and other attendant benefits including payment of retirement benefits and regular pension, along with interest, within time frame to be fixed by this Court.

ORDER

3.In the said circumstances, while dismissing the writ petition as withdrawn, the respondents are directed to complete the process of enquiry within a period of 6(six) weeks from the date of receipt of copy of this order. The respondents are also directed to take into consideration the health condition of the petitioner and take a decision with due empathy and understanding.

4.With the above observations, this Writ Petition stands dismissed as withdrawn. No costs. Consequently, the connected miscellaneous petitions are closed.
