PETITION FOR ANTICIPATORY BAIL Under Sec. 438 Cr.P.C.

ORDER : The Court Made the following order :-

The petitioners, who apprehend arrest at the hands of the respondent police for the alleged offence under Section 379 of IPC in Crime No.68 of 2022, on the file of the respondent police, seek anticipatory bail.

2. The prosecution case is that on 11.04.2022, when the *de facto* complainant received an information that the petitioners were involved in illegal transportation of 1 unit of river sand being illegally loaded for further transportation by using tipper lorry bearing registration No. TN 31 AD 1600.

3. The learned counsel for the petitioner submitted that the petitioners are innocent persons and they have not committed any such offence as alleged by the prosecution. He further submitted that the petitioners have been falsely implicated in this case. Hence, he pleads for anticipatory bail.



4. The learned Government Advocate (Crl. Side) appearing for the respondent raised objection for granting anticipatory bail to the petitioners stating that the petitioners had illegally transported 1 unit of river sand and abandoned the sand along with the vehicle on seeing the raiding party and he further submitted that there is no previous bad antecedents against the petitioners.

5. Taking note of the fact that the petitioners have no bad antecedents, this Court is inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioners on condition that the petitioners shall deposit a sum of Rs.20,000/- (Rupees Twenty Thousand Only) each, in the District Collector's Fund and on such deposit and production of receipt before the learned concerned Magistrate, the petitioners may be granted anticipatory bail with certain conditions;

6. Accordingly, the petitioners are ordered to be released on bail in the event of arrest or on their appearance, within a period of seven days from the date of receipt of a copy of this order, before the learned District Magistrate cum Judicial Magistrate, Pochampalli, on condition that each of the petitioners shall execute separate bond for a sum of Rs.50,000/- (Rupees Fifty thousand only), with two sureties for a like sum to the satisfaction of the learned Magistrate concerned and on further conditions that:

(a) the petitioners shall deposit a sum of Rs.20,000/- (Rupees Twenty Thousand only) each, before the concerned District Collector's Fund as non-refundable deposit. After receipt of the above said amount, the same has to be deposited by the concerned District Collector to the credit of the *District Mines and Minerals Foundation Trust* as non-refundable deposit;

(b) if the petitioners failed to surrender before the concerned Magistrate within a period of 7 days from the date of receipt of a copy of this order, this order shall stand automatically cancelled;

(c) the petitioners and the sureties shall affix their photographs and left thumb impression in the surety bond and the Court concerned may obtain a copy of their Aadhar card or Bank pass Book to ensure their identity;

(d) the petitioners shall report before the Investigation Officer daily at 10.30.a.m., until further orders;

(e) the petitioners shall not tamper with evidence or witness either during investigation or trial;



(f) the petitioners shall not abscond either during investigation or trial;

(g) on breach of any of the aforesaid conditions, the learned Magistrate/ Trial Court is entitled to take appropriate action against the petitioners in accordance with law as if the conditions have been imposed and the petitioners released on bail by the learned Magistrate/Trial Court himself as laid down by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in *P.K.Shaji Vs. State of Kerala [(2005) AIR SCW 5560]*; and;

(h) if the accused thereafter absconds, a fresh FIR can be registered under Section 229-A IPC.

7. However, grant of anticipatory bail shall not stand in the way of the authorities to initiate confiscation proceedings relating to the vehicle involved in the offence.
