The petitioners, who apprehend arrest at the hands of the respondent police for the offences punishable under Sections 6(2)(3)(4) of TNSC (RDCS) Order 1982 r/w Section 7(i) a(ii) EC 1955 in Crime No. 60 of 2022 on the file of the respondent police, seek anticipatory bail.

2.The learned Government Advocate (Crl.Side) has furnished a copy of the First Information Report and it indicates that the petitioners are the absconding accused in a case where the following essential commodities were seized for possessing without proper authority.
