PETITION FOR ANTICIPATORY BAIL Under Sec. 438 Cr.P.C.

ORDER : The Court Made the following order :-

The petitioners, who apprehend arrest at the hands of the respondent police upon complaint given by the defacto complainant before the respondent police, seeks anticipatory bail.

2. The case of the prosecution is that the defacto complainant lodged a complaint before the respondent policed stated that the petitioners have cheated a sum of Rs.8,00,000/- from her. Hence, the complaint.

3.The learned Government Advocate (Crl. Side) submitted that the complaint has been given by one Narmadha and petition enquiry is pending in CSR No.123 of 2022.

4.Recording the submissions made by the learned Government Advocate (Crl. Side), this Court is inclined to grant anticipatory bail to petitioners with conditions.



5. Accordingly, the petitioners are ordered to be released on bail in the event of arrest or on their appearance, within a period of fifteen days from the date of receipt of a copy of this order, before the learned Judicial Magistrate No.I, Coimbatore, on condition that each of the petitioners shall execute a separate bond for a sum of Rs.25,000/-only (Rupees Twenty Five Thousand Only), to the satisfaction of the respondent police or the police officer who intends to arrest or to the satisfaction of the learned Magistrate concerned and on further condition that:

(a) the petitioners and the sureties shall affix their photographs and left thumb impression in the surety bond and the Court concerned may obtain a copy of their Aadhar card or Bank pass Book to ensure their identity;

(b) the petitioners shall not tamper with evidence or witness either during investigation or trial;

(c) the petitioners shall report before the Investigating Officer as and when required for interrogation;

(d) the petitioners shall not abscond either during investigation or trial;

(e) on breach of any of the aforesaid conditions, the learned Magistrate/ Trial Court is entitled to take appropriate action against the petitioner in accordance with law as if the conditions has been imposed and the petitioner released on bail by the learned Magistrate/Trial Court himself as laid down by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in P.K.Shaji Vs. State of Kerala [(2005) AIR SCW 5560]; and;

(f) if the accused thereafter absconds, a fresh FIR can be registered under Section 229-A IPC.
