PETITION FOR ANTICIPATORY BAIL Under Sec. 438 Cr.P.C.

ORDER : The Court Made the following order :-

The petitioners, who apprehend arrest at the hands of the respondent police for the alleged offences under Sections 430 & 379 of IPC in Crime No.122 of 2022, on the file of the respondent police, seek anticipatory bail.

2. The case of the prosecution is that the petitioners herein are alleged to have filled three units of sand in the Tipper lorry bearing registration No. TN 21 AM 8537 near the burial ground by using JCB bearing registration No. TN 21 BM 7076.

3. The learned counsel appearing for the petitioners would submit that the petitioners are innocent persons and they have been falsely implicated in this case. Hence, he pleads for grant of anticipatory bail to the petitioners.



4. The learned Additional Public Prosecutor appearing for the respondent police submitted that there is no previous case pending against these petitioners.

5. Considering the facts and circumstances of the case, the custodial interrogation of the petitioners is not necessary in this case and hence, this Court is inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioners.

6. Accordingly, the petitioners are ordered to be released on bail in the event of arrest or on their appearance, within a period of fifteen days from the date of receipt of a copy of this order, before the Learned Judicial Magistrate Court No.I, Walajapet, on condition that each of the petitioners shall execute a bond for a sum of Rs.25,000/- (Rupees Twenty Five Thousand Only) with two sureties each for a like sum to the satisfaction of the respondent police or the police officer who intends to arrest or to the satisfaction of the learned Magistrate concerned and on further condition that:

(a) the petitioners and the sureties shall affix their photographs and left thumb impression in the surety bond and the Court concerned may obtain a copy of their Aadhar card or Bank pass Book to ensure their identity;

(b) the petitioners shall not tamper with evidence or witness either during investigation or trial;

(c) the 1st petitioner shall report before the respondent Police for a period of four weeks and thereafter as and when required by the respondent police for interrogation and the 2nd petitioner being a lady, shall appear before the respondent Police as and when required for interrogation;

(d) the petitioners shall not abscond either during investigation or trial;

(e) on breach of any of the aforesaid conditions, the learned Magistrate/ Trial Court is entitled to take appropriate action against the petitioners in accordance with law as if the conditions have been imposed and the petitioner released on bail by the learned Magistrate/Trial Court himself as laid down by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in P.K.Shaji Vs. State of Kerala [(2005) AIR SCW 5560]; and;



(f) if the accused thereafter absconds, a fresh FIR can be registered under Section 229-A IPC.
