



4. The learned Additional Public Prosecutor submitted that the petitioner was found in possession of 1.250 Kg of ganja, 10 LSD stamp and MDMA drugs tablets and it is commercial quantity. If the petitioner released on bail, he would tamper the witnesses and hamper the evidence. Hence, he vehemently opposed to grant bail to the petitioner.

5. It is seen that the petitioner was found in possession of alleged contraband and there are materials to attract the offence as against the petitioner herein. Therefore, the petitioner failed to satisfied the twin conditions under Section 37 of the NDPS Act. Taking consideration of the above facts and circumstances of the case, this Court is not inclined to grant bail to the petitioner.

6. Accordingly, this Criminal Original Petitions is dismissed.
