PETITION FOR ANTICIPATORY BAIL Under Sec. 438 Cr.P.C.

ORDER : The Court Made the following order :-

The petitioners apprehend arrest at the hands of the respondent police for the offences punishable under Sections 147, 427, 323 and 506 (i) I.P.C, in Crime No.45 of 2022, and they have filed this petition seeking for anticipatory bail.

2. The case of the prosecution is that on 25.12.2021 at about 1 p.m., the petitioners picked up a quarrel with the defacto complainant and subsequently assaulted her and damaged her house and also threatened her with dire consequences. Hence, the complaint.

3. The learned counsel appearing for the petitioners submitted that due to property dispute, a false case has been foisted against the petitioners. Hence, he prays for grant of anticipatory bail.



4. The learned Additional Public Prosecutor appearing for the respondent submitted that there is no previous case against the petitioners. However, he opposed to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioners.

5. Taking into consideration the above facts and circumstances of the case and also of the fact that there is no previous case against the petitioners, this Court is inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioners, subject to the following conditions.

6. Accordingly, this Criminal Original Petition is allowed. The petitioners are ordered to be released on bail in the event of arrest or on their appearance, within a period of fifteen days from the date of receipt of a copy of this order, before the learned **Judicial Magistrate, Cheyyur, Chengalpattu District**, on condition that each of the petitioners shall execute a bond for a sum of **Rs.25,000/- (Rupees Twenty Five Thousand only)** with two sureties for a like sum to the satisfaction of the learned Magistrate concerned and on further conditions that:

[a] the petitioners and the sureties shall affix their photographs and left thumb impression in the surety bond and the Magistrate may obtain a copy of their Aadhaar card or bank pass book to ensure their identity.

[b] the petitioners shall report before respondent police as and when required for interrogation.

[c] the petitioners shall not tamper with the evidence or witness either during investigation or trial.

[d] the petitioners shall not abscond either during investigation or trial.

[e] On breach of any of the aforesaid conditions, the learned Magistrate/Trial Court is entitled to take appropriate action against the petitioners in accordance with law as if the conditions have been imposed and the petitioners are released on bail by the learned Magistrate/Trial Court himself as laid down by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in **P.K.Shaji vs. State of Kerala [(2005)AIR SCW 5560]**.



[f] If the accused thereafter absconds, a fresh FIR can be registered under Section 229-A IPC.
