PETITION FOR ANTICIPATORY BAIL Under Sec. 438 Cr.P.C.

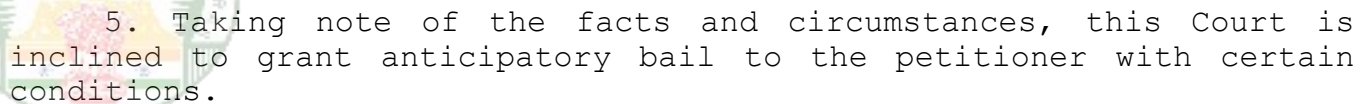
ORDER : The Court Made the following order :-

The petitioner, who apprehends arrest at the hands of the respondent police for the offences punishable under Sections 6(4) of Tamil Nadu Scheduled Commodity (RDCS) Order, 1982 and r/w Section 7(i)(a)(ii) of the Essential Commodities Act, 1955, in Crime No. 58 of 2022, seeks anticipatory bail.

2. The case of the prosecution is that the petitioner was found in possession of 2300 Kgs of PDS rice in 50 bags without getting any permission or license from the State Government. Hence the complaint.

3. The learned counsel appearing for the petitioner would submit that the case has been foisted against the petitioner and he is no way connected with the alleged offence. He would further submit that A1 was arrested and released on bail. Hence, he prays for grant anticipatory bail to the petitioner.

4. The learned Additional Public Prosecutor submitted that there are two accused involved in this case. As far as this petitioner is concerned, he is the owner of the vehicle and he is arrayed as A2. He would also submit that the petitioner has one previous case against him. Hence, he vehemently opposed to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioner.



[a]the petitioner and the sureties shall affix their photographs and left thumb impression in the surety bond and the Magistrate may obtain a copy of their Aadhar card or Bank pass Book to ensure their identity;

[c] the petitioner shall report before the respondent police daily at 10.30 a.m., for a period of two weeks and thereafter as and when required for interrogation.

[e] the petitioner shall not abscond either during investigation or trial;

[g] if the accused thereafter absconds, a fresh FIR can be registered under Section 229-A IPC.
