PETITION FOR ANTICIPATORY BAIL Under Sec. 438 Cr.P.C.

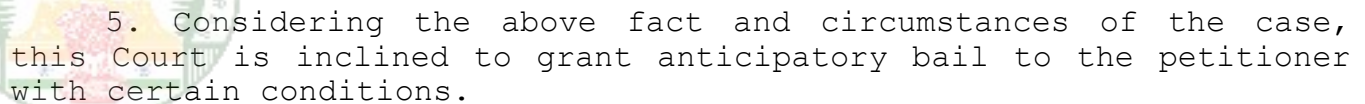
ORDER : The Court Made the following order :-

The petitioner, who apprehends arrest at the hands of the respondent police for the alleged offences punishable under Sections 294(b), 387 and 506(ii) of IPC in Crime No. 1346 of 2021, seeks anticipatory bail.

2. The case of the prosecution is that the petitioner along with other accused went to the defacto complainant's house and searching a house for rent, for which, the defacto complainant showed the rental house, at that time, the petitioner along with other accused abused and demanded money from him with dire consequences and escaped from the scene of occurrence. Hence, the complaint.

3. The learned counsel for the petitioner would submit that the petitioner has not committed any offence as alleged by the prosecution and he is ready to abide by any stringent conditions that may be imposed on him. Therefore, he prays for grant anticipatory bail to the petitioner.

4. The learned Additional Public Prosecutor would submit that there are totally three accused involved in this case. The petitioner is arrayed as A1. However, he vehemently opposed to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioner.



[a] the petitioner and the sureties shall affix their photographs and Left Thumb Impression in the surety bond and the Magistrate may obtain a copy of their Aadhar card or Bank pass Book to ensure their identity.

[b] the petitioner shall stay at Kancheepuram and report before the Inspector of Police, Kancheepuram Town Police Station, Kancheepuram daily at 10.30 a.m. and 05.30 p.m. for a period of two weeks and thereafter report before the respondent police daily at 10.30 a.m and 05.30 p.m. for a period of four weeks and thereafter report before the respondent police as and when required for interrogation.

[c] the petitioner shall not tamper with evidence or witness either during investigation or trial.

[d] the petitioner shall not abscond either during investigation or trial.

[e] On breach of any of the aforesaid conditions, the learned Magistrate/Trial Court is entitled to take appropriate action against the petitioner in accordance with law as if the conditions have been imposed and the petitioner released on bail by the learned Magistrate/Trial Court himself as laid down by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in P.K.Shaji vs. State of Kerala [(2005)AIR SCW 5560].



[f] If the accused thereafter absconds, a fresh FIR can be registered under Section 229A IPC.
