ORDER

The petitioner, who was arrested and remanded to judicial custody on 09.09.2022 for the offences punishable under Sections 4(1)(a), 4(1-A) of Tamil Nadu Prohibition Act, in Crime No.147 of 2022 on the file of the respondent police, seek bail.

2. The case of the prosecution is that on 09.09.2022, on receipt of the secret information, when the respondent police and their team conducted search, they found that the petitioner was in illegal possession of 10 litres of ID Arrack. Hence, the complaint.

3. The learned counsel appearing for the petitioner would submit that this is the second bail application and this Court had earlier dismissed the bail application filed in Crl.O.P.No.23845 of 2022 vide order dated 29.09.2022 on the ground that the petitioner has got three previous cases. He would further submit that the petitioner is an innocent person and he has been falsely implicated in this case. He would also submit that without prejudice, the petitioner is prepared to deposit some considerable amount to

any welfare scheme of the Government and he is prepared to abide by any stringent conditions that may be imposed by this Court and hence, he prays for grant of bail to the petitioner.

4. The learned Government Advocate (Crl.Side) appearing for the respondent would submit that the petitioner was in illegal possession of 10 litres of ID Arrack. He would further submit that there are 3 previous cases as against the petitioner and this is the second bail application of this petitioner before this Court. Hence, he vehemently opposed to grant bail to the petitioner.

5. Heard the learned counsel for the petitioner and the learned Government Advocate (Crl.Side) and perused the materials available on record.

6. In order to curb the illegal activities of transporting illicit arrack, this Court is of the opinion that the petitioner shall deposit a sum of Rs.10,000/- (Rupees Ten thousand only) as non refundable deposit to "The Dean/Medical Officer, Government Mohan Kumaramangalam Medical

College Hospital, Salem", without prejudice to his rights and contentions before the trial Court.

7. Merely, because the petitioner deposits the said amount, it would not amount to admission of his guilt. Therefore, it is open to the trial Court to deal with the case independently.

8. Taking into consideration the facts of the case and the submissions made by the learned counsel and also taking note of the fact that the petitioner has prepared to deposit Rs.10,000/- to any welfare scheme of the Government, this Court is inclined to grant bail to the petitioner with certain conditions.

9. Accordingly, the petitioner is ordered to be released on bail on condition to make a non refundable deposit of **Rs.10,000/- (Rupees Ten thousand only)** by way of Demand Draft/RTGS/NEFT to the "The Dean/Medical Officer, Government Mohan Kumaramangalam Medical College Hospital, Salem" without prejudice to his rights and contentions before the trial Court, on such deposit and production of proof, the petitioner

is ordered to be released on bail on his executing a bond for a sum of **Rs.25,000/-(Rupees Twenty Five thousand only)** with **two sureties**, each for a like sum to the satisfaction of the **learned Judicial Magistrate Court-I, Attur**, and on further conditions that:

[a] the sureties shall affix their photographs and Left Thumb Impression in the surety bond and the Magistrate may obtain a copy of their Aadhar card or Bank pass Book to ensure their identity;

[b] the petitioner shall report before the respondent Police daily at 10.30 a.m., until further orders;

[c] the petitioner shall not tamper with evidence or witness either during investigation or trial;

[d] the petitioner shall not abscond either during investigation or trial;

[e] On breach of any of the aforesaid conditions, the learned Magistrate/Trial Court is entitled to take appropriate action against the petitioner in accordance with law as if the conditions have been imposed and the petitioner released on bail by the learned Magistrate/Trial Court himself as laid down by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in **P.K.Shaji vs. State of Kerala [(2005)AIR SCW 5560]**;
