PETITION FOR ANTICIPATORY BAIL Under Sec.438 of Cr.P.C

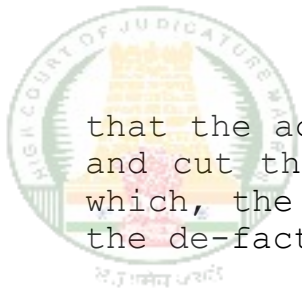
PRAYER :-

For Anticipatory Bail in Crime No.4/2022 on the file of the Respondent Police.

ORDER : The Court made the following order :-

The petitioners/Accused Nos.1 to 4, apprehending arrest at the hands of the respondent police for the alleged offences punishable under Sections 147, 447, 427, 294(b) and 506(I) I.P.C, in Crime No.4 of 2022 on the file of the respondent police, seek anticipatory bail.

2. The case of the prosecution is that after the property dispute between the de-facto complainant and the petitioner, trouble arose between them. On 01.01.2022 at about 6.45 p.m., it is alleged



that the accused person entered into the de-facto complainant's land and cut the trees. There was a quarrel between them, in respect of which, the counter case was registered in Crime No.5 of 2022 against the de-facto complainant parties. Hence, the complaint.

3. The learned counsel for the petitioners submitted that the petitioners are innocent and they have been falsely implicated in this case.

4. The learned Government Advocate (Crl. Side) for the respondent police submitted that offence under Section 427 IPC is also incurred. But the value of the trees which were cut, is not mentioned in FIR.

5. Considering the facts and circumstances of this case, this Court is inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioners.

6. Accordingly, this Criminal Original Petition is allowed and petitioners are ordered to be released on bail in the event of arrest or on their appearance, before the learned Judicial Magistrate I, Usilampatti on condition that the petitioners shall execute a bond for a sum of Rs.10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand only) with two sureties each for a like sum to the satisfaction of the learned Magistrate concerned and the petitioners shall appear before the respondent police once in a month at 10.30 a.m. until further orders. The petitioners shall comply with the condition stipulated under Section 438 Cr.P.C. scrupulously.

7. The petitioners shall appear before the concerned Magistrate within a period of 15 days from the date on which the order copy made ready, failing which, the petition for anticipatory bail stands dismissed.
