PETITION FOR ANTICIPATORY BAIL Under Sec.438 of Cr.P.C

PRAYER :-

For Anticipatory Bail in Crime No.4 of 2022 on the file of the Respondent Police.

ORDER : The Court made the following order :-

The petitioner/Sole Accused, apprehending arrest at the hands of the respondent police for the alleged offence punishable under Sections 379 IPC r/w 21(1) of Mines and Minerals (Development and Regulation) Act, in Crime No.4 of 2021 on the file of the respondent police, seeks anticipatory bail.

2. On the side of the petitioner, it is stated that the case of the prosecution is that the petitioner transported $\frac{1}{4}$ unit of river sand in a bullock cart and prayed the petitioner to be released on anticipatory bail.

3.On the side of the prosecution, it is stated that the petitioner transported the river sand in a bullock cart. The offence is serious in nature and prayed the petition to be dismissed. It is fairly admitted that the petitioner is not having any previous cases.

4.The sand involved is only $\frac{1}{4}$ unit. Considering the nature of offence, this Court is inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioner with certain conditions.
