PETITION FOR ANTICIPATORY BAIL Under Sec.438 of Cr.P.C

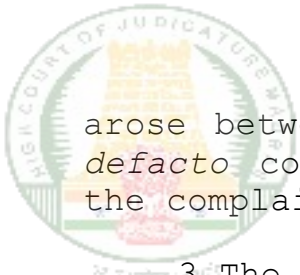
PRAYER :-

For Anticipatory Bail in Crime No.4 of 2022 on the file of the Respondent Police.

ORDER : The Court made the following order :-

The petitioners/Accused, who apprehend arrest at the hands of the respondent police for the offences punishable under Sections 147, 148, 294(b), 323, 324, 506(ii) IPC and Section 4 of Tamil Nadu Prohibition of Harassment of Women Act, in Crime No.4 of 2022, seek anticipatory bail.

2.The case of the prosecution is that there was matrimonial dispute between the parties, the petitioner went to the house of the defacto complainant and requested to return the sridhana articles belonged to the daughter of the first accused. At that time, trouble



arose between them and the accused persons abused & assaulted the *defacto* complainant and threatened with dire consequences. Hence, the complaint.

3. The learned counsel for the petitioners would submit that there was matrimonial dispute between the parties and that the injured was discharged from the hospital. Hence, prays to release them on anticipatory bail.

4. The learned Government Advocate (Crl.Side) appearing for the respondent would submit that the injured was discharged from the hospital and the petitioners are not having any previous case at their credit.

5. Considering the matrimonial dispute between the parties, that the injured has been discharged from the hospital, this Court is inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioners with certain conditions.

6. Accordingly, the petitioners are ordered to be released on bail in the event of arrest or their appearance, before the learned Judicial Magistrate, Mudukulathur and on their executing a bond for a sum of Rs.10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand only) each with two sureties, each for a like sum to the satisfaction of the learned Magistrate concerned and the petitioners shall appear before the respondent police daily at 10.30 am for a period of one month and thereafter, as and when required for interrogation. The petitioners shall comply with the conditions stipulated under Section 438 Cr.P.C. scrupulously.

7. The petitioners shall appear before the concerned Magistrate within a period of fifteen days from the date on which the order copy made ready, failing which, the petition for anticipatory bail stands dismissed.
