PETITION FOR ANTICIPATORY BAIL Under Sec.438 of Cr.P.C

PRAYER :-

For Anticipatory Bail in Crime No.54 of 2022 on the file of the Respondent police.

ORDER : The Court made the following order :-

The petitioner/Accused No.1, apprehending arrest at the hands of the respondent police for the alleged offence punishable under Sections 294(b), 323, 324 and 506 (ii) I.P.C, in Crime No.54 of 2022 on the file of the respondent police, seeks anticipatory bail.

2.The case of the prosecution is that due to pathway dispute between the petitioners's wife and the de-facto complainant, forbearing which, the petitioner and other accused abused the de-facto complainant in filthy language and the petitioner's wife attacked the de-facto complainant with broomstick, thereby, she suffered injuries. Hence, the complaint.

3.The learned counsel for the petitioner submitted that the petitioner is innocent and he has been falsely implicated in this case. The co-accused were already been granted anticipatory bail by the Sessions Court.

4.The learned Government Advocate (Crl. Side) for the respondent police submitted that the injured person has been
admitted in the hospital.



5.Considering the nature of offence, the overt act attributed against the petitioner, the injured person has been discharged from the hospital and the co-accused have been released on bail, this Court is inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioner.

6.Accordingly, this Criminal Original Petition is allowed and petitioner is ordered to be released on bail in the event of arrest or on his appearance, before the learned Judicial Magistrate No.III, Trichy, on condition that the petitioner shall execute a bond for a sum of Rs.10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand only) with two sureties each for a like sum to the satisfaction of the learned Magistrate concerned and the petitioner shall appear before the respondent police daily at 10.30 a.m. until further orders. The petitioner shall comply with the condition stipulated under Section 438 Cr.P.C. scrupulously.

7.The petitioner shall appear before the concerned Magistrate within a period of 15 days from the date on which the order copy made ready, failing which, the petition for anticipatory bail stands dismissed.
