PETITION FOR ANTICIPATORY BAIL Under Section 438 of Cr.P.C.

PRAYER :-

For Anticipatory Bail in Crime No.60 of 2022 on the file of the Respondent police.

ORDER : The Court made the following order :-

The petitioners/A.1 to A.4, who apprehend arrest at the hands of the respondent police for the offences punishable under Sections 147, 294(b), 427, 447 and 506(1) IPC, in Crime No.60 of 2022 on the file of the respondent police, seek anticipatory bail.

2.The case of the prosecution is that the the defacto complainant's brother and the first petitioner are husband and wife and due to some misunderstandings, the first petitioner had left the matrimonial home and on 21.01.2022, the petitioners and other accused trespassed into the building of the defacto complainant and



threatened the person, who is running a shop on rent in that building, and asked him to go out from the building. Hence, the complaint.

3. The learned counsel for the petitioners would submit that the petitioners are innocents and they have not committed any offence as alleged by the prosecution.

4. The learned Government Advocate (Criminal Side) appearing for the respondent police would submit that no one was injured in the incident and that the petitioners are not having any previous cases.

5. Considering the facts that there existed family dispute between the parties, that no one was injured in the incident, that except the offence under Section 506(1) IPC, all other offences are bailable in nature and that the petitioners are not having any previous cases, this Court is inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioners with certain conditions.

6. Accordingly, the petitioners shall deposit a sum of **Rs.2,500/- (Rupees Two Thousand and Five Hundred Only)** each to the Madurai Bench of Madras High Court Advocates Welfare Fund [Indian Bank High Court Branch, Madurai, Current Account No.7087208431, IFSC IDIBI000H040] without prejudice to their rights and contentions before the trial Court and produce the receipt/acknowledgment before the learned Judicial Magistrate, Vadipatti.

7. On production of such receipt/acknowledgment, the petitioners are ordered to be released on bail in the event of arrest or on their appearance, within a period of fifteen days from the date of receipt of a copy of this order, before the learned Judicial Magistrate, Vadipatti, on condition that the petitioners shall execute a bond for a sum of **Rs.25,000/- (Rupees Twenty Five Thousand only)** each with two sureties each for a like sum to the satisfaction of the learned Magistrate concerned and on further conditions that:

[a] the petitioners and the sureties shall affix their photographs and left thumb impression in the surety bond and the Magistrate may obtain a copy of their Aadhaar card or bank pass book to ensure their identity.

[b] the petitioners 2 and 4 shall report before the respondent police daily at 10.30 a.m., for a period of one month and thereafter, as and when required for interrogation and the petitioners 1 and 3 shall report before the respondent police as and when required for interrogation.

[c] the petitioners shall not tamper with the evidence or witness either during investigation or trial.

[d] the petitioners shall not abscond either during investigation or trial.

[e] On breach of any of the aforesaid conditions, the learned Magistrate/Trial Court is entitled to take appropriate action against the petitioners in accordance with law as if the conditions



have been imposed and the petitioners released on bail by the learned Magistrate/Trial Court himself as laid down by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in **P.K.Shaji vs. State of Kerala [(2005)AIR SCW 5560]**.
[f]If the accused thereafter absconds, a fresh FIR can be registered under Section 229-A IPC.
