PETITION FOR ANTICIPATORY BAIL Under Sec.438 of Cr.P.C

PRAYER :-

For Anticipatory Bail in Cr.No.139/22 on the file of the respondent police.

ORDER : The Court made the following order :-

The petitioner / accused No.3, apprehending arrest at the hands of the respondent police for the offences punishable under sections 392 and 506(ii) of I.P.C., in Crime No.139 of 2022, on the file of the respondent police, seeks anticipatory bail.

2.Heard both sides.

3.The learned Government Advocate (Criminal Side) appearing for the respondent police would submit that the investigation is in progress.

4.The overt act attributed against the petitioner herein is that he had scolded the defacto complainant with filthy words and demanded money by threatening him.



5. Taking into account the nature of the overt act attributed against the petitioner and the offence for which the petitioner has been implicated is not a major offence, this Court is inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioner with certain conditions.

6. Accordingly, the petitioner is ordered to be released on bail in the event of arrest or on his appearance, within a period of fifteen days from the date of receipt of a copy of this order, before the learned Judicial Magistrate No.I, Dindigul, on condition that the petitioner shall execute a bond for a sum of **Rs.25,000/- (Rupees Twenty Five Thousand only)** with two sureties each for a like sum to the satisfaction of the learned Magistrate concerned and on further conditions that:

[a] the petitioner and the sureties shall affix their photographs and left thumb impression in the surety bond and the Magistrate may obtain a copy of their Aadhaar card or bank pass book to ensure their identity.

[b] the petitioner shall report before the respondent police daily at 10.30 a.m., for a period of one month and thereafter, as and when required for interrogation.

[c] the petitioner shall not tamper with the evidence or witness either during investigation or trial.

[d] the petitioner shall not abscond either during investigation or trial.

[e] On breach of any of the aforesaid conditions, the learned Magistrate/Trial Court is entitled to take appropriate action against the petitioner in accordance with law as if the conditions have been imposed and the petitioner released on bail by the learned Magistrate/Trial Court himself as laid down by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in **P.K.Shaji vs. State of Kerala [(2005)AIR SCW 5560]**.
