PETITION FOR ANTICIPATORY BAIL Under Sec.438 of Cr.P.C

PRAYER :- For Anticipatory Bail in Cr.No.82/22 on the file of the
respondent police.

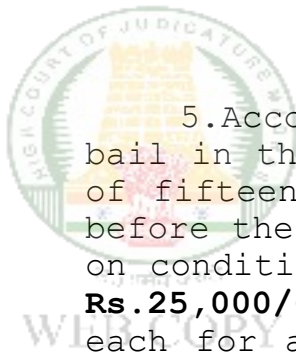
ORDER : The Court made the following order :-

The petitioners / accused Nos.2 and 6, apprehending arrest at
the hands of the respondent police for the offences punishable under
sections 109, 147, 148, 294(b), 307, 323 and 324 of I.P.C., and
Section 4 of Tamil Nadu Prohibition of Women Act, 2002, in Crime
No.82 of 2022, on the file of the respondent police, seek
anticipatory bail.

2.Heard both sides.

3.The learned Government Advocate (Criminal Side) appearing for
the respondent police would submit that it is a case in counter case
between the petitioners and the defacto complainant and the injured
have been discharged from the hospital and the investigation is in
progress.

4.Considering the fact that the injured have been discharged
from the hospital, this Court is inclined to grant anticipatory bail
to the petitioners with certain conditions.



5. Accordingly, the petitioners are ordered to be released on bail in the event of arrest or on their appearance, within a period of fifteen days from the date of receipt of a copy of this order, before the learned Judicial Magistrate, Vadipatti, Madurai District, on condition that the petitioners shall execute a bond for a sum of **Rs.25,000/- (Rupees Twenty Five Thousand only)** each with two sureties each for a like sum to the satisfaction of the learned Magistrate concerned and on further conditions that:

[a] the petitioners and the sureties shall affix their photographs and left thumb impression in the surety bond and the Magistrate may obtain a copy of their Aadhaar card or bank pass book to ensure their identity.

[b] the petitioners shall report before the respondent police daily at 10.30 a.m., for a period of one month and thereafter, as and when required for interrogation.

[c] the petitioners shall not tamper with the evidence or witness either during investigation or trial.

[d] the petitioners shall not abscond either during investigation or trial.

[e] On breach of any of the aforesaid conditions, the learned Magistrate/Trial Court is entitled to take appropriate action against the petitioners in accordance with law as if the conditions have been imposed and the petitioners released on bail by the learned Magistrate/Trial Court himself as laid down by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in **P.K.Shaji vs. State of Kerala [(2005)AIR SCW 5560]**.
