PETITION FOR ANTICIPATORY BAIL Under Sec.438 of Cr.P.C

PRAYER :-

For Anticipatory Bail in Crime No.10 of 2022 on the file of the respondent police

ORDER : The Court made the following order :-

The petitioners / accused No.2 to 5, apprehending arrest at the hands of the respondent police for the offences punishable under sections 120(B), 417, 420, 465, 468, 470, 471, 294(b), 506(i) of I.P.C., in Crime No.10 of 2022, on the file of the respondent police, seeks anticipatory bail.

2.Heard both sides.

3.The averments in the complaint seems to implicate the first accused directly and insofar as the overt act attributed as against the petitioners herein may not constitute an offence at all. However, such aspects open for the investigation. As such this Court is inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioners.

4.Accordingly, the petitioners are ordered to be released on bail in the event of arrest or on their appearance, within a period of fifteen days from the date of receipt of a copy of this order, before the learned Judicial Magistrate No.I, Trichy, on condition that the petitioners shall execute a bond for a sum of **Rs.25,000/- (Rupees Twenty Five Thousand only)** each with two common sureties



each for a like sum to the satisfaction of the learned Magistrate concerned and on further conditions that:

[a]the petitioners and the sureties shall affix their photographs and left thumb impression in the surety bond and the Magistrate may obtain a copy of their Aadhaar card or bank pass book to ensure their identity.

[b]the petitioners shall report before the respondent police daily at 10.30 a.m., for a period of one month and thereafter, as and when required for interrogation.

[c]the petitioners shall not tamper with the evidence or witness either during investigation or trial.

[d]the petitioners shall not abscond either during investigation or trial.

[e]On breach of any of the aforesaid conditions, the learned Magistrate/Trial Court is entitled to take appropriate action against the petitioners in accordance with law as if the conditions have been imposed and the petitioners released on bail by the learned Magistrate/Trial Court himself as laid down by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in **P.K.Shaji vs. State of Kerala [(2005)AIR SCW 5560]**.
