PETITION FOR ANTICIPATORY BAIL Under Sec.438 of Cr.P.C

PRAYER :-

For Anticipatory Bail in Crime No.82 of 2022 on the file of the Respondent police.

ORDER : The Court made the following order :-

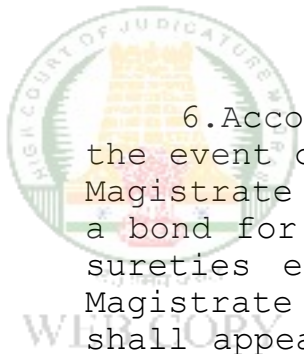
The petitioner apprehending arrest at the hands of the respondent police for the alleged offence punishable under Sections 147, 148, 294(b), 336, 427 and 506(ii) of IPC on the file of the respondent police in Crime No.82 of 2022, seeks anticipatory bail.

2.The case of the prosecution is that due to election motive between the parties, the petitioner and other accused persons abused the de-facto complainant in filthy language and threatened him with dire consequences and also damaged his vehicle. Hence, the complaint.

3.The learned counsel for the petitioner would submit that the petitioner is innocent and he has not committed any offence as alleged by the prosecution.

4.The learned Government Advocate (Crl.Side) would submit that no one has sustained injury in this case.

5.Considering the nature of the allegation levelled against the petitioner and considering the fact that no one has sustained injury in this case, this Court is inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioner with certain conditions.



6. Accordingly, petitioner is ordered to be released on bail in the event of arrest or on his appearance before the learned Judicial Magistrate No.II, Srivilliputhur, Virudhunagar, and on his executing a bond for a sum of Rs.10,000/- (Rupees Ten thousand only) with two sureties each for a like sum to the satisfaction of the learned Magistrate concerned and on further condition that the petitioner shall appear before the respondent police daily at 10.30 am., for a period of one month and thereafter, as and when required for interrogation. The petitioner shall comply with the conditions stipulated under Section 438 Cr.P.C scrupulously.

7. The petitioner shall appear before the concerned Magistrate within a period of 15 days from the date on which the order copy made ready, failing which, the petition for anticipatory bail shall stand dismissed.
