PETITION FOR ANTICIPATORY BAIL Under Sec.438 of Cr.P.C

PRAYER :-

For Anticipatory Bail in Crime No.191 of 2022 on the file of the Respondent Police.

ORDER : The Court made the following order :-

The petitioner/Accused, who apprehends arrest at the hands of the respondent police for the offences punishable under Section 379 of IPC and Section 21(4) of the Mines and Minerals (Development & Regulation) Act, 1957, in Crime No.191 of 2022, seeks anticipatory bail.

2.The case of the prosecution is that the accused had illegally transported two gunny bags of river sand without any valid permit. Hence, the complaint.

3.On the side of the petitioner, it is stated that the petitioner is not connected with the offence and that the petitioner is not having any previous case. Hence, he prays to release him on anticipatory bail.

4.The learned Government Advocate (Crl. Side) appearing for the respondent would submit that the petitioner had illegally transported two gunny bags of river sand without any valid permit.

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It is fairly admitted that the petitioner is not having any previous case.

5. Considering the submissions made by both sides, this Court is inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioner with certain conditions.

6. Accordingly, the petitioner is ordered to be released on bail in the event of arrest or his appearance, before the learned Judicial Magistrate, Thiruvaiyaru and on his executing a bond for a sum of Rs.10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand only) with two sureties, each for a like sum to the satisfaction of the learned Judge concerned and the petitioner shall appear before the respondent police daily at 10.30 am until further orders. The petitioner shall comply with the conditions stipulated under Section 438 Cr.P.C. Scrupulously.

7. The petitioner shall appear before the concerned Judge within a period of fifteen days from the date on which the order copy made ready, failing which, the petition for anticipatory bail stands dismissed.
