PRAYER: Writ Petition filed under Article 226 of the Constitution of India, praying this Court to issue a Writ of Mandamus directing the respondents to permit the petitioner to conduct Aadal Padal cultural programmes in the eve of Arulmighu Sri Jambuthuraiamman Temple festival, J.Mettur Village, Nilakottai Taluk, Dindigul District on 13.06.2022 from 7.00 p.m. onwards and to provide adequate police protection.

O R D E R

This writ petitioner filed this Writ Petition seeking for issuance of a Writ of Mandamus directing the respondents to permit the petitioner to conduct 'Aadal Padal' cultural programmes in the eve of Arulmighu Sri Jambuthuraiamman Temple festival, J.Mettur Village, Nilakottai Taluk, Dindigul District on 13.06.2022 from 7.00 p.m. onwards and to provide adequate police protection.

2.Mr.M.Sakthikumar, learned Government Advocate (Criminal Side) takes notice for the respondents. By consent, this writ petition is taken up for final disposal at the admission stage



3.The learned counsel appearing for the petitioner submitted that temple festival, by name, Arulmighu Sri Jambuthuraiamman Temple situated at J.Mettur Village, Nilakottai Taluk, Dindigul District is going to be held on 13.06.2022. Subsequent to the same, in order to conduct a cultural programme, they sought permission of the police by giving a representation dated 06.06.2022. But the respondents have not considered the said representation. Since no order was passed, the petitioner has come before this Court for the above said relief.

4.The learned Government Advocate (criminal side) appearing for the respondent police would submit that the respondents have received the representation of the petitioner and the same is pending for consideration.

5. I have considered the submission of the learned counsel appearing for the petitioner and the learned Government Advocate (criminal side) appearing for the respondent police.

6. It is brought to the notice of this Court that the Director General of Police, Tamil Nadu, Chennai had issued a circular memorandum in Rc.007301/Genl.I (1)/2019 dated 09.04.2019 along with instructions to the Inspectors of Police throughout Tamil Nadu for consideration of applications seeking permission for conducting cultural programme. Therefore, in view of the detailed circular and guidelines issued by the Director General of Police, the third respondent police is hereby directed to consider the representation of the petitioner dated 06.06.2022 and pass suitable orders based on the above said circular.

7. With the above direction, this writ petition is disposed of. No costs.
