Transfer Civil Miscellaneous Petition filed under Section 24 C.P.C. to withdraw the case in H.M.O.P.No.4 of 2022 from the file of the Sub Court, Melur, Madurai District and transfer the same to the Family Court, Madurai.

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ORDER

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This Transfer Civil Miscellaneous Petition has been filed seeking transfer of H.M.O.P.No.4 of 2022 from the file of the Sub Court, Melur, Madurai District, to the file of the Family Court, Madurai.

2. The petitioner herein is the wife and the first respondent herein is the husband. The marriage between them was solemnized on 05.02.2015, as per Hindu Rites and Customs and out of the wedlock, they are blessed with a child. Due to some misunderstanding, now, they are living separately. Thereafter, the first respondent has filed H.M.O.P.No.4 of 2022 before the Sub Court, Melur, Madurai District, seeking divorce. Now, the petitioner along with her child is living along with her old-aged parents at Madurai. Since the petitioner alone has to take care of her child and her aged parents and there is no one to accompany her, she finds it difficult to travel from Madurai to Melur. Hence, she filed the present Transfer Civil Miscellaneous Petition to transfer the case in H.M.O.P.No.4 of 2022 from the file of the Sub



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Court, Melur, Madurai District, to the file of the Family Court, Madurai.

3. The learned counsel appearing for the petitioner submits that the petitioner and her child are living with her aged parents at Madurai. Further, the petitioner is not having sufficient means to travel and she depends upon her parents to meet out her day-to-day expenses. Since she alone has to take care of her child and her aged parents and there is no one to accompany her, she finds it difficult to travel from Madurai to Melur for appearing before the Sub Court, Melur, for each and every hearing.

4. Though notice was served on the respondent and his name has been printed in the cause list, there is no representation on behalf of him either in person or through a counsel.

5. The Hon'ble Apex Court in the case of *Amitha Shah vs-*



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Virendar Lal Shah, reported ***(2003)10 SCC 609*** has held that *the convenience of the wife and more so of the child must be taken into account while deciding the petition for transfer* and in the case of Rajani ***Kishor Paradeshi Vs Kishor Babulal Paradeshi*** reported in ***(2005) 12 SCC 237***, the Hon'ble Apex Court has held that in such type of transfer petitions, the convenience of the wife is to be preferred over the convenience of the husband.

6. This Court, by taking into consideration that the convenience of wife is to be taken into consideration at the time of considering transfer petitions as held by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in the judgments cited supra, is inclined to allow the present petition.

7. Accordingly, the Transfer Civil Miscellaneous petition stands allowed. The proceedings in H.M.O.P.No.4 of 2022 pending on the file of the Sub Court, Melur, is withdrawn and ordered to be transferred to the file of the Family Court, Madurai. The Sub Court, Melur, is



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directed to transmit the entire case records to the Family Court, Madurai, forthwith. The learned Judge, Family Court, Madurai, shall dispose of the case as expeditiously as possible. No costs. Consequently, connected miscellaneous petition is closed.
