PETITION FOR BAIL Under Sec.439 of Cr.P.C.

PRAYER :-

For Bail in Crime No. 198 of 2022 on the file of the respondent police.

ORDER : The Court made the following order :-

The petitioner/Accused, who was arrested and remanded to judicial custody on 22.08.2022 for the offences punishable under Section 27(1) of Arms Act, 1959 in crime No.198 of 2022 on the file of the respondent police, seeks bail.

2.The case of the prosecution is that the petitioner was found in possession of 2 ½ feet sword. Hence, the complaint.

3.The learned counsel for the petitioner would submit that the petitioner is innocent and he has not committed any offence as alleged by the prosecution. He would further submit that the petitioner is in judicial custody from 22.08.2022, hence he may be released on bail.

4.The learned Additional Public Prosecutor would submit that the petitioner is a history sheeted rowdy element and he is having 8 previous cases and the investigation is not yet completed. He would further submit that eight witnesses have already been examined. Hence, he strongly opposed to grant bail to the petitioner.



5. Considering the facts and circumstances of the case, so considering the period of incarceration and also the fact that eight witnesses have already been examined, this Court is inclined to grant bail to the petitioner on certain conditions.

6. Accordingly, this Criminal Original Petition is allowed and the petitioner is ordered to be released on bail, on executing a bond for a sum of Rs.10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand only) with two sureties each for a like sum to the satisfaction of the learned Judicial Magistrate No.II, Sivagangai.

(i) the sureties shall affix their photographs and left thumb impression in the surety bond and the Magistrate/concerned court may obtain a copy of their Aadhar card or Bank Pass Book to ensure their identity;

(ii) the petitioner shall report before the respondent police on every Sunday at 10.30 a.m., until further orders;

(iii) the petitioner shall not tamper with evidence or witness;

iv) the petitioner shall not abscond during trial.

v) On breach of any of the aforesaid conditions, the learned Magistrate/Trial Court is entitled to take appropriate action against the petitioner in accordance with law as if the conditions have been imposed and the petitioner released on bail by the learned Magistrate/Trial Court himself as laid down by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in P.K.Shaji vs. State of Kerala [(2005)AIR SCW 5560].
