PETITION FOR ANTICIPATORY BAIL Under Sec.438 of Cr.P.C

PRAYER :-

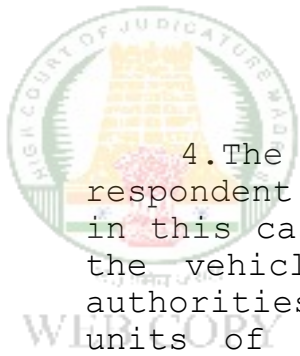
For Anticipatory Bail in Crime No.186/2020 on the file of the
Respondent Police.

ORDER : The Court made the following order :-

The petitioner/Accused, who apprehends arrest at the hands of
the respondent police for the offence punishable under Section 379
of IPC, in Cr.No.186 of 2020, seeks anticipatory bail.

2.The case of the prosecution is that the petitioner along with
other accused have committed the offence of theft of 15 units of
gravel sand by using two Kitachi vehicles. Hence, the complaint.

3.The learned counsel for the petitioner would submit that the
petitioner is innocent and he has been falsely implicated in this
case. However, he would further submit that the petitioner shall
abide any condition imposed by this Court.



4.The learned Government Advocate (Crl.Side) appearing for the respondent police would submit that totally 5 accused are involved in this case. The petitioner was arrayed as A2. He is the driver of the vehicle. Without getting any permission from the concerned authorities, the petitioner along with other accused have taken 15 units of gravel sand in the patta land. 6 witnesses have been examined. Charge Sheet is ready. But, however, considering the gravity of the offence, he strongly opposed to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioner.

5.Considering the facts and circumstances of the case and also considering the fact that the Charge Sheet is ready and 6 witnesses have been examined, this Court is inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioner with certain conditions.

6.Accordingly, the petitioner shall pay a sum of **Rs.5,000/- (Rupees Five Thousand only)** to the **High Court Legal Services Authority, Madurai Bench of Madras High Court, Madurai**, without prejudice to his rights and contentions before the trial Court and produce the receipt before the learned Judicial Magistrate, Valliyoor, Tirunelveli District.

7.On production of such receipt, the petitioner is ordered to be released on bail in the event of arrest or his appearance, within a period of fifteen days from the date of receipt of a copy of this order, before the learned Judicial Magistrate, Valliyoor, Tirunelveli District, on condition that the petitioner shall execute a bond for a sum of Rs.10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand only) with two sureties, each for a like sum to the satisfaction of the respondent Police or to the Police Officer, who intends to arrest or to the satisfaction of the learned Magistrate concerned and on further conditions that:

(a)the petitioner and the sureties shall affix their photographs and left thumb impression in the surety bond and the Magistrate may obtain a copy of their Aadhar card or Bank pass Book to ensure their identity;

(b)the petitioner shall report before the respondent police daily at 10.30 a.m., until further orders.

(c)the petitioner shall not tamper with evidence or witness either during investigation or trial;

(d)the petitioner shall not abscond either during investigation or trial;

(e)on breach of any of the aforesaid conditions, the learned Magistrate/ Trial Court is entitled to take appropriate action against the petitioner in accordance with law as if the conditions have been imposed and the petitioner released on bail by the learned Magistrate/Trial Court himself as laid down by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in **P.K.Shaji Vs. State of Kerala [(2005) AIR SCW 5560]**; and;



(f) if the accused thereafter absconds, a fresh FIR can be registered under Section 229-A IPC.
