**CRIMINAL PETITION No.11631 of 2018**

**ORDER:**

This Criminal Petition is filed under Section 482 of the Code of Criminal Procedure by the petitioner accused for quash of proceedings against him in Cr.No.233 of 2018 of Narayanaguda Police Station registered for the offence under Section 376 of the Indian Penal Code.

2. No representation on behalf of the petitioner.
3. Learned Assistant Public Prosecutor has submitted that subsequent to filing of the Criminal Petition, since no interim stay orders were granted by this Court, the Police concerned have completed entire investigation and also filed charge sheet, which was numbered as S.C.No.409 of 2019 on the file of learned XI Additional Metropolitan Sessions Court, Hyderabad and to that extent letter dated 14.07.2022 addressed by Inspector of Police, Narayanaguda Police Station is filed.
4. In view of the above submission, since entire investigation is completed and charge sheet is also filed, the very purpose of filing the Criminal Petition to quash the proceedings in Cr.No.233 of 2018 of Narayanaguda Police Station is defeated

and thereby Criminal Petition has become infructuous and liable to be dismissed.

5. Accordingly, the Criminal Petition is dismissed as infructuous.

As a sequel, pending miscellaneous applications, if any, shall stand closed.
