The instant application has been filed for placing on record
Marriage Certificate of the petitioners as Annexure A-1.

For the reasons mentioned in the application, the same is
allowed.

Marriage Certificate of the petitioners is taken on record as
Annexure A-1.

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On 31.01.2022, when the matter was taken up for hearing, the
learned counsel for the petitioners had submitted that petitioner No.2 by
then attained majority and were in the process of getting married.

The learned counsel for the petitioners submits that this is the first
marriage between the petitioners.

The petitioners have prayed for issuance of necessary
directions to the official respondents for protecting their civil/personal

rights and liberties from being invaded by the private respondents. Petitioners are alleged to have solemnized marriage on 08.02.2022 (Annexure P-1) on attaining the age of majority. They feel reasonable apprehension and a threat perception at the hands of the private respondents and pray that their personal/civil rights be not violated by them.

Precisely, in the context of aforesaid relief, petitioners have approached the Senior Superintendent of Police, District Fatehgarh Sahib, Punjab-respondent No.2 by way of representation dated 19.12.2021 (Annexure P-3).

Notice of motion to respondent Nos.1 to 3.

On the asking of the Court, Mr. Kirat Singh Sidhu, Deputy Advocate General, Punjab accepts notice on behalf of respondent Nos.1 to 3. He submits on instructions from ASI Mandeep Singh that the statement of the girl was recorded under Section 164 Cr.P.C., in which she had stated that she had gone with petitioner No.2 with her own will. Learned State counsel further submits that petitioner No.1 has been arrested on 11.02.2022 in case FIR No.37 dated 09.02.2022 registered under Sections 363 and 366-A IPC. Due to this factor, petitioner No.2 is residing with her parents.

In view of the facts mentioned hereinabove, no further orders are required to be passed.

Petition stands disposed of accordingly.
