ANOOP CHITKARA, J. (Oral)

This petition has been filed under Section 482 Cr.P.C. for setting aside order dated 04.01.2022 (Annexure P-5) whereby respondent No.2 has been granted permission to travel abroad from 05.01.2022 to 20.01.2022.

Learned counsel for respondent No.2 submits that respondent No.2 was allowed to go abroad and has returned. As such, this petition has become infructuous.

Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that a direction was also given to respondent No.2 to surrender his passport before the trial Court.

However, learned counsel for respondent No.2 submits that passports of all other co-accused have been returned. Therefore, there is no need to surrender the passport of respondent No.2. In any case, respondent No.2 is required to surrender his passport, then respondent No.2

shall either deposit the passport within 15 days or he shall file necessary application seeking dispensation from surrendering his passport before the trial Court.

With the above observations, this petition is disposed of as having been rendered infructuous.
