The petitioner herein seeks the relief of regular bail in the criminal case arisen out of the FIR bearing No.329 dated 11.10.2021 registered at Police Station Bilaspur, District Yamuna Nagar, under Sections 406, 420 and 506 IPC with the allegations that he introduced the complainant to his co-accused named Islam, who purchased the truck from the complainant vide a written agreement whereby he agreed to repay the instalments of the loan amount in respect thereof but later-on, the above-said Truck was sold to some other person and the petitioner was an attesting witness to the said agreement.

2. Reply on behalf of the respondent-State, by way of the affidavit of Deputy Superintendent of Police, Bilaspur (Yamuna Nagar), along-with Annexures R-1 and R-2 as well as the vernacular versions thereof, has been submitted in the Court today and these documents are taken on the record.

3. I have heard learned counsel for the petitioner as well as learned State counsel in the present petition and have also perused the file carefully.

4. Learned counsel for the petitioner contends that the petitioner is behind the bars in this case since the date of his arrest, i.e 12.10.2021 and the Challan has already been presented and the charges have also been framed against him and therefore, he deserves the relief as prayed for in this petition.

5. Learned State counsel does not dispute the afore-referred factual position.

6. Keeping in view the above-discussed facts and circumstances as well as the facts that the trial of the case is likely to take sufficient time to conclude and that no useful purpose will be served by detaining the petitioner in judicial custody any more and without commenting or expressing any opinion on the merits of the case, the petitioner named Nek Mohammad alias Neki is ordered to be released on regular bail subject to his furnishing the requisite personal and surety bonds to the satisfaction of learned trial Court/Chief Judicial Magistrate/Duty Magistrate concerned.

7. The instant petition stands allowed accordingly.
