[1] Prayer in the petition is for initiating proceedings against the respondent for intentional and willful defiance of order, Annexure P/1, dated 15.10.2012 in CWP No.20795 of 2011 in case titled as Ashok Kumar and others vs. State of Punjab and another.

[2] A perusal of order, Annexure P/1 dated 15.10.2012 reveals that CWP No.20795 of 2011 was disposed of by directing the Corporation to pay full pension to the petitioner w.e.f. November, 2011 onwards with arrears on account of difference in pension to be paid upto March 31, 2013.

[3] At the outset, learned counsel for the petitioner states that payment has been released to the petitioner in terms of order, Annexure P/1 dated 15.10.2012 as well as orders passed in LPA and SLP (c) No(s).23825-23826 of 2014, therefore, in the circumstances, the petitioner does not wish to pursue the instant petition and may be permitted to withdraw the same.

[4] In view of the position noted above as well as the statement of learned counsel for the petitioner, the instant petition is disposed of as not calling for any action against the respondent under the Contempt of Courts
