Through this petition, the petitioner seeks anticipatory bail in case bearing FIR No.181 dated 09.12.2021, registered at Police Station Sector 31, District Chandigarh, under Sections 415, 418, 420 and 120-B IPC.

Vide order dated 11.01.2022 passed by this Court, *ad interim* anticipatory bail was granted to the petitioner.

Learned counsel for the petitioner and learned counsel for respondent No. 2 submit that the entire payment has been made by the petitioner to respondent No. 2 and now there is no grievance between them.

Learned Addl. PP UT Chandigarh, does not dispute the aforesaid fact.

Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that pursuant to the aforesaid order dated 11.01.2022, the petitioner has joined the investigation.

Learned State counsel, on instructions from SI Akhtar Hussain, submits that the petitioner has joined the investigation and he is not required for any further investigation.

I have heard the learned counsel for the parties.

In view of the above, without commenting on the merits of the case, the present petition is allowed and the order dated 11.01.2022 granting *ad interim* anticipatory bail to the petitioner is made absolute, subject to the conditions envisaged in Section 438 (2) of the Code of Criminal Procedure.
