[1] Prayer in the petition is for initiating proceedings against the respondent for intentional and willful defiance of order, Annexure P/1 dated 29.04.2019 in CWP No.10971 of 2019 in case titled as Paramjit Singh vs. State of Punjab and Ors.

[2] A perusal of order, Annexure P/1 reveals that CWP No.10971 of 2019 was disposed of by directing the respondent to consider and decide application/representation dated 17.10.2018 within six weeks from the date of receipt of certified copy of the judgment.

[3] At the outset, learned counsel for the petitioner states that pursuant to the compliance report having been called for vide order dated 09.01.2020, the respondent has taken a decision on the application/representation dated 17.10.2018 as also taken action against the persons carrying out illegal constructions by making said persons responsible for the illegal constructions by requiring them to pay compounding fee as is evident from Annexure R/1 dated 14.08.2019,

therefore, in the circumstances, the petitioner is not interested in pursuing

the instant petition and may be permitted to withdraw the same.

[4] In view of the position noted above as well as the statement of learned counsel for the petitioner, the contempt petition is disposed of as not calling for any action against the respondent under the Contempt of Courts Act, 1971.
