This is a petition that has been filed for grant of regular bail to the petitioners in FIR No.0291 dated 06.08.2021 registered under Sections 406, 420 of the IPC (Sections 467, 468, 471, 120-B IPC added later on) at Police Station Safidon, District Jind.

Counsel for the petitioners would contend that the petitioners have been falsely implicated in the said matter. It is argued that the allegations against the petitioners are that they provided bank account of co-accused Digvijay which has been used for depositing the part of cheated amount and that also after purchasing four fake IDs handed over the same to main accused Akhlesh and each of them received Rs.11,000/-. It is further argued that the only role attributed to the petitioners, who are not named in the FIR, is that they supplied mobile sim cards, which according to the State, are based on fake IDs. It is submitted that the matter has been

investigated, therefore, prays for grant of regular bail to the petitioners.

Learned counsel for the respondent-State would oppose grant of regular bail to the petitioners by contending that the petitioners are the ones who prepared fake IDs, sim cards, which were used by the co-accused.

I have heard learned counsel for the parties and deem it appropriate to allow regular bail to the petitioners considering the fact that the main dispute, as per the FIR, would be of cheating done by the BSP Enterprises.

Accordingly, the instant petition is allowed and the petitioners are directed to be released on regular bail on their adequate execution of personal/surety bonds to the satisfaction of concerned trial court/Duty Magistrate.

However, any observation made herein shall not be construed to be an expression of opinion on merits of the case.
