Present petition has been filed under Section 439 Cr.P.C. for grant of regular bail to the petitioner in case bearing FIR No.118, dated 16.05.2021, registered under Sections 323, 506 & 34 of IPC and Section 307 IPC added during investigation, at Police Station Nigdhu, Karnal.

Learned counsel for the petitioner relies upon the order passed by this Court on 18.01.2022 in **CRM-M No.1314 of 2022 - “*Raj Kumar vs. State of Haryana*”**, whereby co-accused Raj Kumar has been granted the concession of regular bail.

Learned counsel for the State is not in a position to make out a case different from one of the co-accused Raj Kumar, rather fairly

admits that the petitioner is at parity with Raj Kumar, who has been granted the regular bail by this Court.

Keeping in view the aforesaid fact, considering the fact that challan stands presented, the conclusion of the trial is likely to take some time and the co-accused Raj Kumar has been granted regular bail by this Court, this Court finds that the accused-petitioner deserves parity and is thus, entitled for grant of regular bail. Accordingly, the present petition is allowed and the petitioner is ordered to be released on regular bail on his furnishing bail/surety bonds to the satisfaction of the trial Court/Duty Magistrate, concerned.

Nothing observed herein shall be construed to be an expression of an opinion on the merits of the case.
