The petitioner prays for grant of anticipatory bail in FIR No.98 dated 02.08.2021, registered under Sections 452, 323, 506, 34 IPC at Police Station Sadar Sangrur, District Sangrur.

The operative part of the order dated 14.01.2022, vide which interim anticipatory bail has been granted to the petitioner, is reproduced as under:-

“...Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that the Additional Sessions Judge has granted the interim anticipatory bail to the petitioner, however, the petitioner could not join investigation as he had gone out being a truck driver and, therefore, later on, his petition was dismissed.

Learned counsel further submits that as per allegations in the FIR, the injuries sustained by the victim are simple in nature....”

Counsel for the petitioner has submitted that, in pursuance to the order dated 14.01.2022, the petitioner has appeared before the Investigating Officer and has joined the investigation.

Counsel for the State, on instructions from ASI Japinder Singh, has not disputed the aforesaid fact and submits that the petitioner is no more required for further investigation.

In view of the above, this petition is allowed and the interim bail granted to the petitioner vide order dated 14.01.2022 is made absolute subject to the conditions envisaged under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C.
