The instant petition has been filed under Section 438 Cr.P.C. seeking grant of anticipatory bail in case FIR No.172 dated 05.08.2021, registered under Sections 307 and 324 IPC (offence under Section 307 IPC deleted and offence under Section 326 IPC added later on) at Police Station City Rajpura, District Patiala.

At the very outset, learned counsel for the petitioner submits that the matter has been compromised between the parties and the compromise to the said effect has been annexed at Annexure P-3.

Notice of motion.

Mr. Tanvir Joshi, Assistant Advocate General, Punjab accepts notice on behalf of the respondent-State. Mr. G.S.Salana, Advocate puts in appearance on behalf of respondent No.2/complainant and admits the factum of compromise having been effected between the parties.

After having heard learned counsel for the parties and keeping in view the fact that the matter has been compromised between the parties, the present petition is disposed of. However, in the event of arrest, the petitioner shall be released on pre-arrest bail at the satisfaction of the Arresting Officer/Investigating Officer subject to the following conditions, as envisaged under section 438(2) Cr.P.C:-

- (i) *that the petitioner shall make himself available for interrogation by a police officer as and when required;*
- (ii) *that the petitioner shall not, directly or indirectly, make any inducement, threat or promise to any person acquainted with the facts of the case so as to dissuade him from disclosing such facts to the Court or to any police officer;*
- (iii) *that the petitioner shall not leave India without the previous permission of the Court.*

Accordingly, the petition stands disposed of.
