The present petition has been filed under Section 482 Cr.P.C. for quashing of cross version vide General Dairy No.30 dated 22.08.2020 registered under Sections 341, 323, 148 and 149 IPC in FIR No.180 dated 22.08.2020 registered under Sections 451, 354-A and 458 IPC at Police Station Sadar Sangrur and all subsequent proceedings arising out of it on the basis of a written compromise dated 24.11.2020 (AnnexureP-3).

On 01.04.2021 and 18.05.2022 this Court had directed the parties to appear before the Illaqa Magistrate/Trial Court for recording of their respective statements with regard to the compromise/settlement, who in turn was directed to submit a report along with the recorded statements with regard to the veracity of the compromise, if any, between the parties as also to apprise this Court if there is any other case pending against them and his/their status of being proclaimed offender/person.

As directed, report dated 07.06.2022 from the Additional Chief Judicial Magistrate, Sangrur, has been received, as per which the parties had recorded their statements before the Trial Court in terms of the compromise arrived at between them and no proclamation proceedings are pending against any of the party.

Learned State counsel has also raised no objection if the present petition is allowed.

In view of the above, continuation of the proceedings in pursuance of the afore-referred FIR in which the offences are not heinous and the matter having been compromised, would be an abuse of the process of law and in terms of the law laid down by the Supreme Court in **Narinder Singh vs. State of Punjab, (2014) 6 SCC 466**, this Court deems it just and proper to allow the petition and resultantly quash the General Dairy No.30 dated 22.08.2020 registered under Sections 341, 323, 148 and 149 IPC in FIR No.180 dated 22.08.2020 registered under Sections 451, 354-A and 458 IPC at Police Station Sadar Sangrur and all proceedings arising therefrom, qua the petitioners.
