This petition has been filed under the provisions of Section 439 of the Cr.P.C., for grant of 'regular bail' to the petitioner in case FIR No. 150, dated 31.05.2021, registered at Police Station Bilaspur, District Yamuna Nagar, for the alleged commission of offences punishable under the provisions of Sections 406/420/120-B of the IPC.

Though learned counsel for the petitioner submits that the petition earlier filed by the petitioner bearing CRM-M-38944-2021 was withdrawn, however, the petitioner has been in custody for the past 9½ months now, with 12 prosecution witnesses still to be examined and with the allegation against the petitioner essentially being to the extent of allegedly having received Rs. 1,00,000/- out of a total sum of Rs. 12,00,000/- that the complainant is alleged to have been duped of.

Learned State counsel submits that with another similar case bearing FIR No. 148, dated 30.05.2021, also standing registered against the petitioner, therefore he does not deserve to be admitted to bail; in reply to which learned counsel for the petitioner submits that the said matter was compromised between the parties.

Looking at the stage of trial and period of custody and the nature of allegations against the petitioner, without making any comment on the actual merits of the case, the petition is allowed. The petitioner shall be admitted to bail upon his furnishing adequate bail bonds and surety bonds to the satisfaction of the learned trial court/Duty Magistrate/Chief Judicial Magistrate concerned.
