While allowing the applicant for grant of succession certificate filed by late Sh. Jodh Singh, the Court granted the succession certificate subject to furnishing the indemnity bond to the tune of Rs.7,00,000/-. The petitioner son of late Sh. Jodh Singh furnished the indemnity bond. On Sh. Raghubir Singh's subsequent application, the aforesaid succession certificate has been revoked by the trial Court. The indemnity bond has been directed to be utilized for the claim of the applicant in the amount withdrawn on the basis of the succession certificate. It may be noted here that the entire amount of Rs.3,40,615/- was withdrawn by late Sh. Jodh Singh.

The learned counsel representing the respondent (Raghubir Singh) admits that his claims are only to the extent of 1/7th share.

Keeping in view the aforesaid facts, the learned counsel representing the petitioners submits that he is prepared to deposit 1/7th share of the amount withdrawn in the Executing Court, within a period of one

month, from today, positively.

With these observations, the revision petition is disposed of and the impugned order passed by the Court shall stand modified accordingly.

All the pending miscellaneous applications, if any, are also disposed of.
