[1] Prayer in the instant petition is for initiating proceedings against the respondents for intentional and willful defiance of order (Annexure P-1) dated 10.02.2020 in CWP No.1564 of 2016 in case titled as '**Karambir Singh versus Managing Director, UHBVNL and another**'.

[2] A perusal of order (Annexure P-1) reveals that CWP No.1564 of 2016 was allowed, respondents were directed to inform the petitioner the amount of employer's contribution towards EPF to be deposited by him alongwith interest within one month, whereafter, the respondents were to count the work charge service of the petitioner towards qualifying service for pensionary / retiral benefits and amount as determined was to be paid within three months from the date of receipt of certified copy of the order.

[3] Learned counsel contends that pursuant to issuance of notice to respondent No.2, respondent No.2 has released benefits to the

petitioner as per entitlement in terms of order (Annexure P-1), therefore, the petitioner is not interested in pursuing the instant petition and may be permitted to withdraw the same.

[4] In view of the position noted above, as well as statement of learned counsel for the petitioner, the instant petition is *disposed of* as not calling for any action against respondent No.2 under the Contempt of Courts Act, 1971.
