The matter has been taken up through video-conferencing on account of outbreak of pandemic COVID-19.

The petitioner has invoked the writ jurisdiction of this Court in terms of Articles 226/227 of the Constitution of India seeking appropriate writ in the nature of mandamus for issuance of directions to the respondents to count the period of work charge service of the petitioner from 08.01.1980 to 03.05.1997 for the purpose of his pensionary benefits, with a further direction to decide representations dated 06.01.2017 (Annexure P1) or dated 24.12.2021 (Annexure P3).

Heard.

Upon hearing learned counsel for the petitioner and perusal of the records, the present petition stands disposed off with direction to the respondents to consider the representation dated 24.12.2021

(Annexure P3) and decide the same in accordance with law by passing a speaking order preferably within a period of one month from the date of receipt of a certified copy of this order.

If found entitled and if there is no impediment for the release of payment, the same be granted to the petitioner without any delay, as per law.

The petition stands disposed off accordingly.
