This order shall dispose of three connected contempt petitions bearing COCP Nos.149, 330 and 155 of 2022. The facts are being noticed from COCP No.149 of 2022.

Complaining violation of directions issued by the Court in CWP-12181-2021, titled as “Raj Kumar and others Vs. State of Punjab and another”, dated 09.07.2021, the petitioners have filed the present petition under Section 12 of the Contempt of Courts Act, 1971. The writ petition was disposed of with the following directions:-

“In view of the consensus arrived at between both sides, but without going into the merits of the controversy, this writ petition is disposed off with a direction to respondent No.2, to consider and decide the aforesaid legal notice dated 27.05.2021 (P-5), in accordance with law by passing a speaking order, preferably within a period of (04) four months from today.”

Admittedly, in compliance of the aforesaid order, a speaking order has been passed by respondent No.2. Learned counsel representing the petitioners submits that the aforesaid order is not made in accordance with law. This aspect can only be adjudicated upon in the appropriate proceedings. In this jurisdiction, the Court is only to see whether the order has been complied with or not.

With all these observations, the petition is disposed of.
