The petitioner has filed this petition under Articles 226 & 227 of the Constitution of India, praying for issuance of a writ in the nature of mandamus directing the respondents to consider and decide the petition dated 16.09.2021 (Annexure P-11) filed by the petitioner under Rule 30 of Central Reserve Police Force Rules, 1955, which is pending for more than four months before respondent No.3, despite reminder dated 17.11.2021; along with certain other prayers.

At the outset, the counsel for the petitioner submits that at this stage the petitioner would be satisfied if respondent No.3 is directed to dispose of the petition (Annexure P-11), within some time bound frame.

Notice of motion.

Ms. Anita Balyan, Sr. Panel Counsel for Union of India, accepts notice on behalf of the respondents-UOI and has submitted that the Union of India is not averse to expeditious disposal of grievance of the petitioner.

In view of the above, respondent No.3 is directed to take a conscious decision upon the petition (Annexure P-11) filed by the petitioner, in accordance with law, within a period of three months from the date of receipt of the certified copy of this order.

The petition stands disposed of with above said direction.
